

The Rights and Responsibilities of Financial Aid Recipients

As a student, you have the right to know.

What financial aid programs are available and how to apply for them

Procedures and deadlines for submitting application(s) for financial aid.

Cost of attendance and howfinancial need is determined.

The type and amount of assistance you will receive, and how and when you will be paid.

That all application information is treated with the highest level of confidentiality.

The eligibility criteria for awarding aid.

The conditions of any loan you accept.

The job description and starting pay rate for any student job you accept.

How the standard of academic progress is determined.

Requirements in the case of withdrawal, refunds, and repayment of financial aid. The contents of your financial aid file, in accordance with the FamilyEducational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)—you may request an appeal if you believe a mistake has been made.

That your financial aid package will be reviewed upon your request if family and/or financial circumstances have changed.

Campus security and crime statistics—available through the Campus Safety Department.

As a student, you have the responsibility to:

Establish plans to meet your educational and living expenses

Submit all forms required to complete the application process in a timely and accurate manner.

Read, understand, and retain copies of all information and/or forms that are sent to you and all other documents you sign.

Comply with the provisions of any aid received, as well as any promissory note(s) and all other agreements you sign.

Notify CIA of all resources (especially outside resources) you receive that are not listed on your award letter.

Keep CIA informed of any change of your address, name, or marital status while you are a student, and until all loans have been repaid in full.

Use aid only for educational expenses related to attending CIA

Waintain satisfactory academic progress

Register and attend dasses for the number of hours required.

Performsatisfactorily in any work assignments accepted through student employment programs
